## Double-Entry Journal

## Why?

- \* Double-Entry or Dialectical Journals provide a non-threatening means for students to respond to literature.
- \* Double-Entry Journals promote writing fluency.
- Double-Entry Journals elicit thinking, reflective questioning, and interpreting of literature.
- Students interact with a particular piece of literature through critical reading.
- Students begin to clarify their thinking about literature while exploring deeper levels of meaning.

## How?

- Students take notes of interesting or important words, phrases or sentences while reading.
- \* Note-taking responses may also be in the form of quotations, images or lists.
- \* Students make connections to the author's work through reactions, responses, questions, summaries, connections, and observations.
