## Where's the Beef?

Some people who write about such things say that the first cheeseburger appeared in 1924 and it was cooked on a grill by a chef named Lionel Sternberger at The Rite Spot in Pasadena, California. Before that, it was always plain old hamburgers! Once the word was out, everyone wanted their burgers with cheese.

Almost everyone I know goes out for a cheeseburger once in a while, but where do they go? Which restaurant makes the best cheeseburgers? What do they put on them? I looked on the Internet to see what fast food companies have to say about their cheeseburgers.

Many two year olds recognize McDonald's famous golden arches and whine and point until Mom goes into the drive thru! What is on one of their cheeseburgers? Unless you ask them to leave things out, their cheeseburgers always have a beef patty, a bun, American cheese, mustard, ketchup, pickle slices and onions (dried).

You can "have it your way" at Burger King, and here's what always goes into their cheeseburgers: a beef patty, sesame seed bun, cheese slice (1), ketchup, pickle slices (2), and mustard. You can also have it with three bacon slices. If you want other things on your cheeseburger, you can always order a Whopper instead.

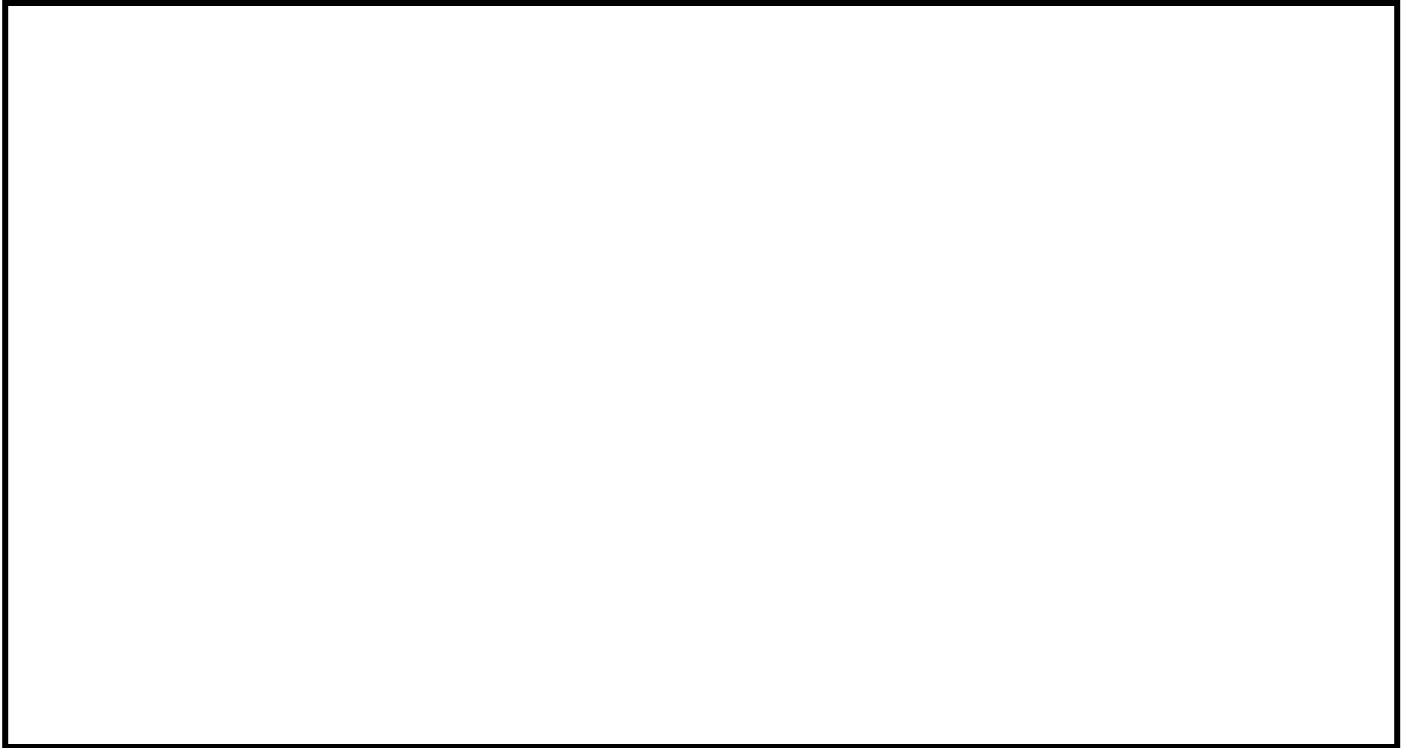
