Carl walked over to his mother and asked, "Did you see my new kittens?"

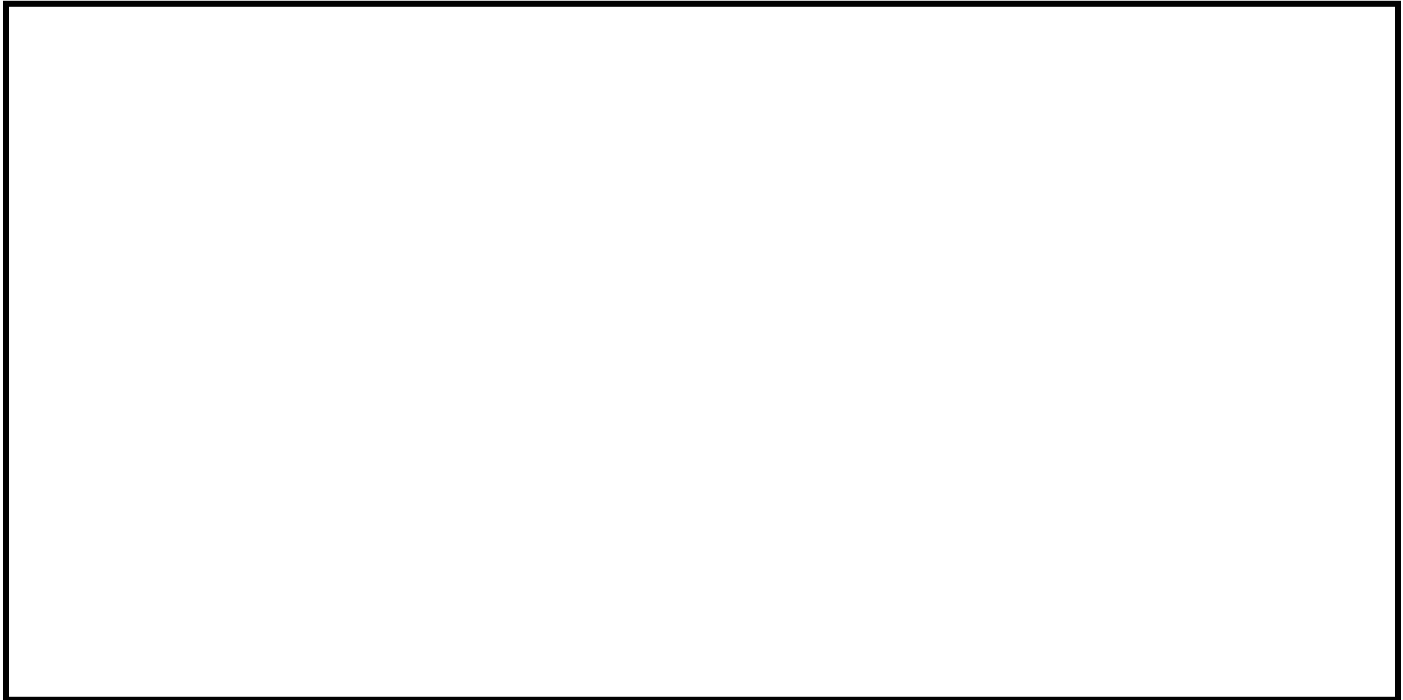
His mother laughed and said, "Yes, I saw your new kittens!"
